BRIEF HISTORY OF M.B. COLLEGE:

The Maharaja Bodhchandra College, popularly known as M.B. College, was established on September 8, 1969 and is situated in the heart of the Imphal city near the Govindaji Temple in 5.03 acres of land. The land was gifted by the then Maharaja of Manipur, ShriOkendrajit Singh, in his revered father's name, His Highness Shri Maharaja Bodhchandrajee Singh (Leishemba). The College is co-educational and is continuing to impart quality education to students till now. It was affiliated to the Gauhati University before the Manipur University was established. Now, it is affiliated to Manipur University. The College is one of theNAACaccredited colleges of Manipur. Earlier it had classes from Class XI to full Degree Course, but now the higher secondary section has been delinked by the State Government and it is imparting education to only Degree courses in both Honours and General Streams. There are 9 (nine) Arts subjects namely, English, Manipuri, Political Science, Education, Economics, History, Geography, Mathematics and Philosophy. ADMISSION:

Number of seats of each respective subjects, number of students to be admitted and percentage of marks are determined by an Admission Committee of the college and changes are made from time to time. Admission will be based on Counselling and percentage of mark scored in their respective subjects. Timely admission notice is widely circulated /published in the local dailies for the benefit of the aspiring students.

Application Form for admission is attached at the end of this prospectus. Applicants are advised to carefully read the subject combination allowed before filling in the form.

COURSES OFFERED:

There are 9 (nine) arts subjects namely, *English, Manipuri, Political Science, Education, Economics, History, Geography, Mathematics* and *Philosophy*.

ORDINANCE OF THE BACHELOR OF ARTS (SIX SEMESTER SYSTEM)

There shall be a six-semester (three year) course of study leading to the award of Bachelor of Arts (Honours) Degree. Each semester shall consist of 90 working days.

(A) Eligibility:

- i. A student who has passed10+2 examination of Council of Higher Secondary Education, Manipur, or equivalent examination recognized by Manipur University is eligible for admission to BA course.
- ii. A student of Bachelor of Arts shall offer the following subjects: Modern Indian Language (Manipuri) or General English in the 1st and 2nd semesters.
 - a) Regional Development (Northeast) (in 3rd semester)
 - b) Environmental Studies (in 4th Semester)
- iii. Elective and Honours subjects (Any three of the following):

(B) Course structure for BA (Honours) and BSc (Honours) under the semester:

Honours Paper shall be one of the Electives offered in the previous semesters.

For a subject involving Practical/ Laboratory classes

- i. The practical examination will carry at least 30% overall weightage.
- ii. for an elective paper of 100 marks comprising of Theory and Practical components, the distribution of marks shall be, generally:

Theory - 75 marks

Practical - 25 marks.

However, for certain subjects. (e.g. Geography), a different distribution may be adopted .

iii) Honours Paper VII in the 5th Semester and Honours Paper X in the 6th Semester may be practical papers.

(c) Eligibility to appear at the End-Semester Examination:

- ✤ A student who has studied a regular course of study for a semester in an affiliated or permitted college may be admitted to the end-semester examination provided the student has attended not less than 75 percent of the lectures delivered, including practical's.
- ✤ A student who has enrolled himself/herself in more than one college/ institute simultaneously shall not be admitted into the end semester examinations.

(d) Promotion:

- ✤ A student who has passed all the papers of the semester examination will be promoted to the next higher semester.
- ✤ A student who has failed in one or two papers in a semester may also be promoted to the next higher semester provided that in no case a student will be promoted to next higher semester if he/she has more than four failed papers at a time.

- Admission into degree and award of certificate: A degree under the seal of the university shall be awarded to a student who has passed all the papers of all the semester examinations.
- Classification and Class and Grade:

A student who has passed all the six semesters in regular attempt shall be placed in the class "Honours with Distinction" if he/she secure at least 85% marks in aggregate of all the subjects in all the semesters.

- For the award of class and grade (except the class of "Honours with Distinction"), the marks obtained in the subject of Honours (Honours papers and corresponding elective papers) will be counted. Eg: For a student offering History as the Honours subject, the marks obtained in the Honours (History) Papers and elective (History) Papers shall be counted.
- ✤ A student who secures 60% or above marks in the Honours subject (Honours paper and corresponding elective papers) shall be placed in First Class Honours.
- ✤ A student who has secured 45% or more marks, but below 60% marks, will be placed in Second Class Honours.
- ✤ A student who has passed all the papers but secures less than 45% marks will be placed in "Pass only" class.
- Admission of the unsuccessful and absentee candidates: A student who was admitted into a semester examination, but could not pass/could not be promoted to the next higher semester may be permitted to appear at the next available regular semester examination as a casual student on payment of necessary prescribed fee.
- ✤ Notwithstanding anything contained in the above clauses a student must complete the course within a continuous span of ten semesters from his/her initial admission.

ASMISSION PROCEDURE:

Eligibility Criteria

Securing minimum 40% marks in aggregate in 10+2 or equivalent examination recognised by Manipur University.

Relaxation

5% relaxation for certain section belonging to ST/SC, OBC, differently abled or Sports persons etc.

*Counselling is mandatory for those students selected for admission (they have participated in the Counselling along with their parent or Local guardian).

SCHEME OF EXAMINATION AND SUBJECTS TO BE OFFERED:

The Manipur University has introduced semester system in the undergraduate courses from the academic session 2010–11. The college strictly follows the guidelines provided by Manipur University regarding conduct of examinations from time to time.

There shall be 6 Semesters (Semester I – VI) during the three year course. In semester I and II, a student has to offer General English or MIL and 3 Elective Papers. Each paper will carry100 marks and shall be evaluated at the end of the semester Examination. The examination of a paper will be 3 hours duration. The pattern for Semester III and IV shall be as per University Ordinance.

Honours shall have to be offered only in Semester V and VI. The Honours Subjects should be one of the Elective Subjects offered in the previous Semester. It shall have three papers of 100 marks each in a Semester. The pattern for Semester V and VI shall be as per University Ordinance.

VOCATIONAL COURSE:

The College introduced a Vocational Course -2 Semester 1 year Diploma Course in "*Computer Hardware Technology*" with an intake capacity of40Students under RUSA, Vocationalisation of Higher Education. The institute tied up with NIELIT, Akampat, as industrial partner and theoretical as well as practical classes have been going on in full swing.
